As well as maintaining our partnership with schools in the Sutton Coldfield area, we have also linked with schools in Erdington. Three girls and two boys in Year 5 have been selected for the district football team. Participation in sport has remained at approximately 75%. The profile of girls in sports has been increased through their success in football, winning the Erdington girls league and coming runners up in the league finals competition at Yardley Power League. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To continue to increase the profile of girls' sport in school across all year groups.
