When your child has received four Gold Awards please send them into school as Mrs Lee would like to award a prize for this achievement.

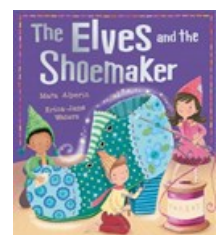


Nursery Curriculum Information

This booklet contains a summary of the teaching and learning targets that we will be covering this half term in Nursery.

Our focus topic will be:

Festivals and Christmas Countdown!



Communication and Language

- Shows interest in play with sounds, songs and rhymes.
- Identifies action words by pointing to the right picture, e.g., “Who’s jumping?”
- Understands more complex sentences and Instructions, e.g. “Put the elves in a row and then count how many there are.”
- Understands the use of objects (e.g. “What do we use to cut things?”)
- Begins to use more complex sentences to link thoughts (e.g. *using and, because*).
- Can retell a simple past event in correct order (e.g. *went down slide, hurt finger*).

Literacy

- Listens to stories with increasing attention and recall.
- Joins in with repeated refrains and anticipates key events and phrases in rhymes and stories.
- Begins to be aware of the way stories are structured.
- Shows interest in illustrations and print in books and print in the environment.
- Sometimes gives meaning to marks as they draw and paint.
- Ascribes meanings to marks that they see in different places.

Mathematics

- Recites some numbers in sequence.
- Uses some language of quantities, such as ‘more’ and ‘a lot’.
- Knows that a group of things changes in quantity when something is added or taken away.
- Begins to talk about the shapes of everyday objects, e.g. ‘round’ and ‘tall’.
- Begins to use the language of size–height and length
- Understands some talk about immediate past and future, e.g. ‘before’, ‘later’ or ‘soon’.

Expressive Arts and Design.

- Sings a few familiar songs.
- Begins to move rhythmically.
- Joins in with dancing and ring games.
- Explores colour and how colours can be changed
- Sings to self and makes up simple songs.
- Makes up rhythms.
- Notices what adults do, imitating what is observed and then doing it spontaneously when the adult is not there.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Shows affection and concern for people who are special to them.
- Forms special friendships
- Can select and use activities and resources , sometimes with help.
- Welcomes and values praise for what they have done.
- Tries to help or give comfort when others are distressed.

Physical Development

- Walks, runs and jumps safely
- To throw and kick a ball
- Begins to use three fingers (tripod grip) to hold writing tools
- Imitates drawing simple shapes such as circles and lines.
- Understands that equipment and tools have to be used safely.

Understanding of the World

- Learns that they have similarities and differences to others.
- Comments and asks questions about their familiar world.
- Operates mechanical toys, e.g. turns the knob on a wind-up toy or pulls back on a friction car.
