What should I already know?

- Talk about, describe and draw simple images. Talk about different mark making media e.g. different types of paint – watercolours, poster paint etc.
- Use sketches to record ideas, thoughts and feelings. Make a range of marks using different tools e.g. painting tools – rollers, palettes, brushes etc.
- Print with a range of objects e.g. potato prints.

Vocabulary

Pop Art	An art movement that emerged in the mid 1950s in Britain and in the late 1950s in the United States.
Comic	A magazine or book that contains a set of stories told in pictures with a small amount of writing.
Outline	A line or set of lines indicating the shape of an object in a sketch or diagram.
Popular	Liked or admired by many people.
Pattern	A repeated decorative design e.g. dotted, striped etc.
Colour	Discuss the bright and fun colour scheme of Pop Art.
Unusual	Pop Art is interesting because it's so different to other artist's work.

Key facts

1. Pop Art is art made from commercial items and cultural icons such as product labels, advertisements, and movie stars.
2. Some people say that Pop Art “pokes fun” at traditional art.
3. Andy Warhol is the most famous Pop Art artist. He played a major role in making this art movement popular.
4. These artists create Pop Art by repeating an item over and over again, changing the colour or texture of the item, or putting different items together to make a picture.
5. Another well-known artist is Roy Lichtenstein. His paintings looked like a

Drawing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Talk about drawing tools and techniques used in different Pop Art images. • Sketch using different types of line e.g. thin, bold, wavy etc. • Create simple drawings replicating famous Pop Art images. Use what they have observed to create their own Pop Art design.
Painting and printing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use an increasing range of painting tools and simple techniques to create their Pop Art picture. • Use string and glue to create a printing block.
Greater Depth	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use a viewfinder to isolate and record parts of an image. • Add notes to drawings where appropriate.
