Vocabulary

Post-impressionism	The work of some famous artists including Van Gogh, who used bright colours and symbols to show emotions and feelings in their artwork.
Portrait	A painting of a person.
Impasto	Using thickly textured paints that often stuck out of the canvas.
Impressionism	A style of painting using dabs of paint and colour, with visible brush strokes.
Abstract	Does not represent reality. Less realistic and more symbolic.
Colour	Link to how this creates a mood from a painting e.g. Van Gogh's dark colours represent his battle with depression.
Landscape	A painting showing a view of natural scenery, like the countryside.
Watercolour	A type of paint which is used with

Key facts

1. The post-impressionist art movement happened between 1886 and 1905. This type of art often had abstract qualities. Artists used bright colours and symbols to show emotions and feelings in their artwork.
2. Van Gogh's brother, Theo, told him about this new style of painting and in 1886, Van Gogh moved to Paris to learn from these new painters.
3. His art became influenced by painters such as Claude Monet, Edgar Degas and Camille Pissarro. He also became good
