KS2 Framework Objectives

- write phrases from memory, and adapt these to create simple sentences, to express ideas clearly
- describe people, places, things and actions orally and in writing

What will I know by the end of the unit?

Most Children will be able to:

- use spoken French to identify parts of the body
- recognise, read and pronounce sounds of combinations of letters, words and set phrases
- name and write the days of the week
- use spoken French to identify different animals
- recognise and use numbers 11 - 20

Some children will also be able to:

- write and say phrases from memory, with clear pronunciation and meaning
- describe hair and eyes with a range of adjectives in simple phrases
- describe character's appearances with one word adjectives/set phrases
- appreciate simple adjectival agreement (Greater Depth)

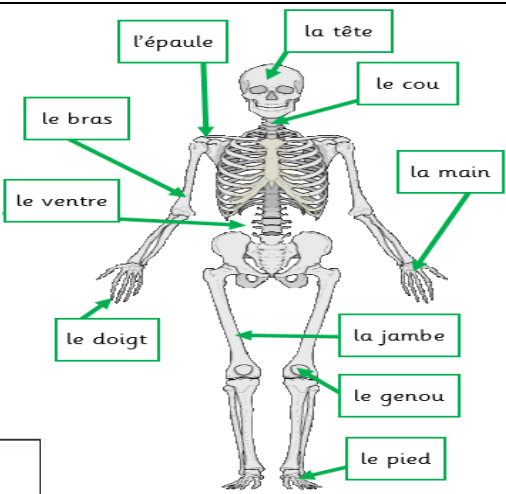
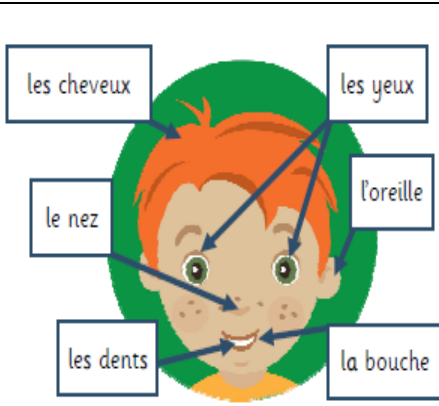
